

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

Saudi Arabia - Ebola Precautions for Hajj



audi Arabian authorities are doing all they can to assure pilgrims that the upcoming Haj will not be affected by the Ebola virus outbreak. In October an estimated three million Muslims from around the world will congregate in Mecca, Saudi Arabia, to perform the Islamic pilgrimage.

Given the current fears over the recent Ebola outbreak in West Africa - which has already killed more than 2,200 people - concerns are growing that such a mass congregation may lead to a further spread of the disease if an infected person or

persons is found in the crowd. The Saudi Arabian Deputy Health Minister for planning and development, Mohammad al-Khasheem, said that all possible precautions are being taken to ensure that the upcoming Haj is a safe one, with steps being taken to prevent an outbreak. Preventative measures also include special equipment at airports to detect anyone who may be infected.

Doctors and hospitals are also going to be on stand-by and ready to treat and monitor any emergency cases that may arise, Gulf News reported.


Scientists: Ozone Layer Recovering

arth's protective but fragile ozone layer is beginning to recover, largely because of the phase-out since the 1980s of certain chemicals used in refrigerants and aerosol cans, a UN scientific panel reported in a rare piece of good news about the health of the planet.

For the first time in 35 years, scientists were able to confirm a statistically significant and sustained increase in stratospheric ozone, which shields us from solar radiation that causes skin cancer, crop damage and other problems.



Islam 'Rejuvenating' British Values



Pritain's former Archbishop of Canterbury, Dr Rowan Williams, has said that Islam is rejuvenating "British values" during a critical speech against segments of Islamophobic segments of the British media.

Speaking to an audience of thousands at the annual Living Islam Festival, organised by the Islamic Society of Britain in Lincolnshire, the ex-archbishop praised Muslim communities that have been working with local parishes to provide family services and youth activities.

The Future will Belong to Muslims


OSCOW - Russia's Orthodox archpriest Dmitri Smirnov has told congregants in his Sunday sermon that the future belongs to Muslims, praising them for offering help to the needy without repay, unlike the Christians in this land.

"The future will belong to the Muslims. The future is theirs," he said.

The archpriest comments came as he was recalling an experience shared with him by an elderly woman in his congregation. According to the woman, Muslim drivers never took money when taking her to church, whereas Christian drivers were only interested in making money.



"A Muslim is not interested in gaining benefit from the old woman. Rather, the Muslim offers to take her around, take her to the laundrette, pay her bills, take her to the market, carry her bags up to her floor or to her elevator (if she has one)," he said.





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Palestine Shall Be Free!



The recent deadly seven-week military operation in Gaza by Zionist Israel initiated in the Mubarak month of Ramadan left at least 2,100 Palestinians martyred and more than 10,000 injured. The horror of the genocide unleashed upon Gaza caused worldwide outrage, shock and people across the globe demonstrated against the carnage. It has made many believe and realise the importance of the Palestinian resistance - a nation fighting for peace, justice and the human right to live in the land of their birth. Hamas's support has surged after a war with with massive casualties and utter devastation mainly all on the one side - this war spoke volumes about the savagery and overall intentions of the Zionists.

During the onslaught on Gaza nothing and nobody was spared. The family home became the most

dangerous place to be in as civilians became the main target. The Masjid considered to be a place of worship and safety was not spared, nor were refugee centers at schools which ought to be protected from all harm by 'International Law'. More than 90 UNRWA schools were bombed in spite of the Israeli military receiving warnings of their co-ordinates over and over again - 12 times in the case of the Beit Hanoun School including four hours before it was bombed, 17 times in the case of the Jabaliya School, and 33 times the coordinates for the Rafah School were passed on by the UN to the Israeli military but still it was struck by Israeli fire resulting in a massacre of civilians there. Those lucky to survive were not free from danger ambulances, hospitals and even graveyards were bombed and reduced to rubble by the heartless Zionists.

Despite the suffering, one thing that has clearly emerged from this latest war is that Hamas has been hailed as a genuine protector of its people and it no longer stands alone. Palestinians across the spectrum have expressed overwhelming support for the fighters who defend their interest of freedom and sovereignty and a have pledged to continue fighting Israel if it did not respond to all Palestinians' demands.

Hamas has fought three wars against Israel and each war has brought a new dawn to the struggle for freedom for Palestine. Many analyst are saying that this war has been the most defining thus far and regard it to be the beginning of the end of Israel. No doubt the PR image of Israel has suffered massively from this war. Local and global boycotts protestations and divestment have piled on the pressure to the extent that the White House and Downing Street were left with no choice but to reluctantly murmur their condemnation for some of the worst injustices committed in recent vears.

The Gaza strip is a narrow strip of land on the Mediterranean coast approximately 41 kilometres long and between 6 and 12 kilometres wide. There is no escape route for

the people locked into this open air prison. About 1.8 million people, live in this area with over one million being registered refugees. People in Gaza have been strangled and confined by a seven year blockade of basic supplies including food, medication, fuel etc.

The present truce that has temporarily brought some relief from the oppression should not cause us to forgot the on-going struggle for a free Palestine. Muslims should continue to sustain the momentum built up during this onslaught until justice prevails. Through intensive dua and seeking Allah Ta'alas Mercy a sustained plan of action must include the following:

- Abundant Istighfar (seeking forgiveness) and collective repentance
- In solidarity with our Palestinian brethren, curtail our extravagance and contribute our savings to the people of Gaza
- Write to the local press and media by expounding on these injustices and human rights violations
- Become committed to practicing Islam in day-to-day life
- Supporting the various initiatives to assist in whatever way possible, the Palestinian people.





Recounting the Past Sins!

Currently I am married for several years and enjoying a harmonious relationship. However, the thought always troubles me that am I being dishonest to my partner by not disclosing the sins of my past. Should I discuss these shortcomings and clear the air?

The mercy of Allah Ta'ala is such that despite our faults and weaknesses He does not disgrace us and continues to shower respect and dignity upon us in society. Hence it is preferable to keep concealed what Allah Ta'ala has concealed for a person. If the matter has no bearing on your current relationship and you have moved on from the past vices, then

there is no reason to disclose or discuss the past.

Due to unchecked emotion and a conceived form of transparency people who have disclosed their past vices to their partners have sorely regretted that naivety. Unfortunately, such "innocent confessions" have been used to condemn the person, to win relationship arguments and to justify the wrongs of the offending partner. Continue with the relationship normally, and avoid raising issues of the past that could potentially jeopardise a harmonious marriage.

Good Marriage Partner

am anxious about finding a good marriage partner and would like some Dua or words that will help me find someone most suitable.

A person should make abundant Dua for all good after every Fard Salah by reciting the Sunnah duas including the Dua for marriage. One may read the attribute (name) of Allah Ta'ala "Ya Jami'u", 500 times, but recite durood shareef 11 times before and after "Ya Jami'u". "Ya Jami'u" means the "One who brings together".

Easy Istikharah?

lease advise me very briefly what is Istikharah and also give me a short way of doing Istikharah.

Istikharah is simply a Dua that can be done at any time of the day or night with the intention of seeking guidance from Allah Ta'ala on a particular matter. One may perform 2 Rakahs of Salah before sleeping and read Allahumma Khirli Wakhtarli eleven times.



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Communicating and Courting before Marriage

A Muslim boy and girl have developed a relationship of closeness with each other and chat with each other daily. They intend to court each other with a view to marriage. Is this acceptable in Islam?

For love to be true and prosperous it must be for Allah Ta'ala's pleasure and in keeping with His Law. Islam teaches us that marriage is the purest and most beautiful relationship that exists between a male and female. To initiate this noble relationship with contaminated elements of romance, courting and lust is

impermissible. Courtship and premarital engagement is a western concept. Outwardly it seems to be a logical thing to get to know the person but ultimately proves to be detrimental to one's faith, marriage and honour.

Knowing each other well before marriage does not guarantee the success of the marriage: following the path of obedience and the Sunnah does. Both these individuals should muster courage, be remorseful about their sinful activity by repenting and seek assistance and guidance from a pious mentor to guide them to the path of chastity and piety.

Differing with Respect

azrat Shaikhul Hadith Moulana Muhammad Zakariya ■ (Rahimahullah) writes, "My father (Moulana Muhammad Yahya) and my mentor Hazrat (Moulana Khaleel Ahmed) had differing views in various issues and rulings. However, since there was no animosity or rancour between them - let alone the public - even the Ulama were not made aware of their differences. An example of their differences was when two or three people had a share in a large Qurbani animal and wished to fix one share on behalf of Rasulullah 🗯 the price of this animal will be shared by all three persons. According to my father this was permissible; according to Hazrat Saharanpuri (Rahimahullah) it was impermissible.

My father lived in the upper quarters and Hazrat Saharanpuri lived in the quarters below. During the days of Qurbani I would see many people asking Hazrat Saharanpuri regarding this ruling. He would say, 'According to me it is not permissible, but according to Moulana Yahya it is. Go upstairs and find out the ruling from him. If he permits, then practice upon it '

This ruling is also permissible according to me (Hazrat Shaikh Rahimahullah) and according to the former Mufti of our Madrasah (Mufti Saeed Ahmed Sahib Rahimahullah) but according to the former principal (Moulana Abdul Lateef Sahib Rahimahullah) it is not permissible. Each of us knew the Fatwa of the other.

I discussed the matter with both of them but they did not accept my view nor did I accept theirs. Despite this fact, never was it announced publicly nor was there any quarrel or dispute."

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The Good Nature of Women

llah Ta'ala has kept certain natural characteristics in women by which they supersede men. These characteristics are most distinctive and inherent in children. The innocence and pure nature of children are vividly illustrated by their soft hearts, their nature to cryeasily, and whenever they "disagree" with adults or others, they make up easily --- without harbouring any ill-feeling or enmity.

Similarly, a woman's heart possesses the innocent qualities of softness, crying easily and making amends quickly. Men need to strive hard to "soften" their hearts with good acts under the guidance of a reliable spiritual mentor. However, women possess this "softness" and "tenderloving-care" naturally, almost automatically. Their hearts are already prepared by Allah Ta'ala with abundant fecundity for the cultivation of softness. All that is needed is for the "seed" to be sown in their bountiful hearts and they excel in attaining proximity to Allah Ta'ala. This "seed" is the abundant and constant Zikr of Allah Ta'ala.

Hakeemul Ummat Hazrat Maulana Thanwi (Rahimahullah) has said that I give the certificate of wilayat (sainthood) to a woman who adopts three qualities with steadfastness and sincerity: 1. Punctuality on salah. 2. Zikrullah. 3. Safeguards the tongue

A woman should be very particular about her Salah and fulfil her qadha (missed Salahs) that she has neglected from after attaining puberty. Additionally, she should be acutely mindful about her cleanliness and missed Salahs after her menses. She should constantly strive to be steadfast on cleanliness and her Salah at all times.

A suggested formula of Zikr is that a woman should recite daily 100 duroods and 100 times subhanallah wa bihamdihi subhanallahil azeemi wa bihamdihi astaghfirullah. This dua was prescribed by Nabi (sallallahu alayhi was sallam) to a Sahabi who complained of constraints and worries. The Sahabi returned after a year to say he has found abundance of peace and prosperity. Consult a mentor to guide one in increasing and sustaining Zikr.

Yet another advice from the Ulama, is for a woman to safeguard her tongue from excessive speaking and making statements of ingratitude to her benefactors like her husband, mother, father, brother, etc.

A lady who is steadfast on these practices shall very quickly acquire the nisbat (connection with) and proximity of Allah Ta'ala. (Insha-Allah)

SA's Latest Danger 'Woonga'

Food Labelling Letter

n recommendation from the South African National Halaal Authority (SANHA), Darul Ihsan Centre has filed an objection to the proposed legislation on Food Labelling which suggests that for every certified product of a company, a non-Halaal product must be made available alongside it. This will have very serious and negative ramifications for all South Africans. It is highly impractical, draconian and burdens the supply chain from manufacturer to consumers with huge logistical and cost challenges.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE LABELLING AND ADVERTISING OF **FOODS: AMENDMENTS**

Darul Ihsan is a multi-purpose, Islamic service providing centre based in Durban, South Africa which works for the upliftment and empowerment of the community through the provision of a variety of essential and quality services. One among its key objectives is to promote a better understanding of Islam and Muslims, thereby serving as a bridge-builder between communities. It is guided and managed by qualified Islamic scholars (Ulama) and its operations are conducted within the framework of the Noble Quran. It aspires to cooperate and network with other organisations for the common good and benefit of humanity.

Please be advised that we object to the aspect of the new labelling law of having dual marking of products i.e. Halaal and non-Halaal.

This law if enacted is draconian and places onerous conditions on all concerned in the supply chain, i.e. manufacturer, transporter to the consumer.

Our organisation opposes such a move as ill-advised and infringes on our religious rights and cautions the Minister in proceeding with same.

However, the family is still in arrears for rates, water usage and electricity and the Centre is in discussion with ward councillors to approach the municipality to alleviate the plight of the family by either reducing or completely cancelling the arrears.

In an act of goodwill and genuine concern for their neighbour, many people in the area have volunteered to assist the family.

Arrangements are also being made to provide the family with furniture, beds, a stove, refrigerator, etc.

Our aim is to provide the family with a comfortable home with the basic necessities. Insha Allah.


The Quran and Inheritance

any Islamic laws are outlined in the Quran by broadly explaining principles. Finer details and explanations are explained through the Ahadith of Rasulullah . However, the importance of the laws of inheritance is such that its laws are mentioned in the Quran in detail. Allah Ta'ala has clearly prescribed what different heirs would receive in the varying situations.

As such it is obvious there is no room for discretion or doubt in these laws. Wealth is tempting and often spurs people to violate the laws of the Shariah in order to obtain wealth. Lest anyone is driven by the same temptation when it comes to inheritance, Allah Ta'ala concludes the verses pertaining to inheritance with the following clear warning:

"Those are the boundaries of Allah ... And he who disobeys Allah and His Rasul and transgresses His boundaries, He (Allah) will enter him into the fire, forever he will dwell therein, and for him is a disgraceful punishment." (Surah Nisa, V.13)

Thus it is imperative that estates are wound up according to the Shariah and that every heir be given fully what is due to him/her. Due to the lack of knowledge of basic aspects in this regard, disputes in matters of estates and



inheritance are encountered regularly.

Darul Ihsan Fatwa Department facilitates and assists with the drawing up of wills as well as assisting in estate mediations. We strongly advise all to be vigilant and safeguard themselves from coming under the purview of the above warning.

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
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Illness is also a Blessing

I am a male in my forties who has survived at least 40 surgical procedures, and still counting! Sickness came when I least expected it and things that I took for granted like having a job and supporting, providing, caring and protecting my family came to a halt.

The situation became insurmountable because on the onehand you have to seek urgent - and costly - hospitalization and surgical procedures for conditions which medication/pain killers cannot relieve and on the other hand you are incapable of providing for your family's needs.

While in hospital I have broken down into tears many times not only because of the excruciating pain that I was going through but also because of the anguish of not being able to provide and care for my family. Imagine how difficult it is not to be able to provide for my family especially when they visit me in hospital and only look upon me as the person who is supposed to be the support they need.

The only person I could turn to is Allah Ta'ala, my Creator and in humility I cried out:

'O Allah, You have given me this sickness and I fully accept it as Your Will. Please do not make my family and me be a burden to anyone. Watch over my family and their needs and give me the strength and ability to endure the pain and the test that I am going through. I am aware the difficulties the Prophets # and Sahaba experienced. Compared to their hardships mine seem minor.'

We must have Iman and trust our Creator. It is difficult to comprehend that 'sickness is a blessing and a mercy from Allah Ta'ala' as it is generally looked at negatively. We must be positive and appreciate that whatever happens does so only through the Will of Allah Ta'ala. We must be strong and have unshakeable faith that - whatever our suffering - it will be followed by ease as this is the promise of the Quran.





House No. 3 Built In Ntuzuma

With the grace of Allah Ta'ala and the contributions of generous donors this crumbling structure was demolished and the brand new house built in its place. The 'Build a Home' team met with the family who expressed their thanks for the visit and appreciation to Darul Ihsan for their efforts. Plans are being drawn for houses number four and five.

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Why Mediation Works

hen a marriage or family dispute becomes difficult to resolve internally by the affected parties then the Noble Qur'an encourages the appointment of mediators from both parties to try and bring about an amicable resolution. Reconciliation of differences has been cited as the most preferred form of settlement. (See Surah 4 Verse 35)

Disputing parties are often not aware of the remarkable potential of mediation as an alternative that can settle disputes and even help to preserve the relationship. Ego and emotion do not allow common sense and good faith to prevail. This leads to endless heartbreak and bitterness between individuals and families.

Mediation is by far the better option than court action and litigation in any dispute. Taking someone to court in an on-going relationship is like trying to remove a fly from someone's head with a hammer. Mediation lets the other side know you are serious and offers a bridge inviting the other side to come to an agreement.

Some negative aspects about litigation and benefits of mediation:

- 1. Safe & Easy Litigation can result in unfair awards while in mediation parties are in complete control. The mediator will not permit unfair tactics so the playing field is equalised.
- 2. Convenient & Affordable Litigation costs thousands for even a simple case without a firm guarantee of resolution. Mediation offers an affordable alternative.
- 3. Saves Time Lawsuits can be lengthy and very frustrating. Mediation shows results in a fraction of that time.
- 4. Confidential and Dignified Court matters are open to the public and media. Mediation is not.
- 5. Solution based system Mediation provides options, solutions and answers. Litigation is hostile and focuses on naming and shaming.

The most important benefit of a healthy mediation is that it is in keeping with the teachings of the Noble Qur'an and Sunnah through which one achieves the pleasure of Allah Ta'ala and a blissful life.

Correct Your Character!

reat emphasis is generally placed on various acts of Ibadah (worship) like optional Salah, Zikr, charity, Umrah, etc. These are indeed most rewarding acts of good that one must strive to practice and reap the rewards. However, there are other acts of Ibadah (worship) that are also relevant to our daily lives and relationships that are compromised and generally not considered as acts of merit.

People tend to be selective in which acts they wish to do and not to do. Islam is a complete way of life and must be practiced completely. We tend to find that the important injunction of good character and upholding noble conduct is often undermined. Some people conduct

themselves with outward piety in society yet behave with their wives, children, employees and subjects in a manner that is devoid of noble character. Rasulullah ## emphasised the importance of good conduct in many Ahadith and gave it a lofty position among the acts of good.

Some Ahadith pertaining to good character:

- Hazrat Abu Darda anarrates that Rasulullah said, "Nothing is more weighty on the scale of deeds than one's good manners." (Sahih Bukhari)
- Hazrat Abdullah bin Amr said, "Rasulullah was never obscene or harsh - rather, he used to say that the best among us are those who have the best manners." (Sahih Bukhari)
- Hazrat Abu Hurayrah said that Rasulullah said, "If one has good manners, one may attain the same level of merit as those who spend their nights in prayer." (Sahih Bukhari)

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Q & A

If a person did not perform the Wajib Qurbani negligently in the past, how should he compensate for it?

If a person had purchased the animal but did not slaughter it during the days of Qurbani then he should give the live animal away in Sadaqah (charity). If an animal was not purchased, then he should give the current value of one Qurbani (sheep or goat) in Sadaqah. One should also seek forgiveness for neglecting the Qurbani that was obligatory upon him.

Is it permissible to use for Qurbani, cattle below 2 years, however, this animal weighs the same, looks the same, and is fed the same food as the other 2 year old cattle

No. Qurbani cannot be made of cattle that are under 2 years of age. The concession of slaughtering an animal that is below the required age but resembles the animals of the required age applies only to sheep that are more than six months old.

Is it permissible to give Qurbani meat to non-Muslims?

Yes, it is permissible to give Qurbani meat to non-Muslims.

Does a lady's Ihraam have to be white or any colour?

There is no specific colour for the Ihraam of a female. It can be any colour. However, it should not be transparent.

Can one Muhrim perform the Halaq or Qasr for another Muhrim?

Yes. It is permissible for one Muhrim (person in the state of Ihraam) to cut or shave the hair of another Muhrim provided all the necessary rites of Hajj have been completed.

If a person passes away in Ihraam, will he be buried in Ihraam or the regular Kafn?

According to the Hanafi Mazhab, a person who passes away in Ihraam will be given a normal Ghusl with soap and will be buried in a normal Kafn covering his head.

Is Jannatul Mua'alla in Makkah as virtuous as Jannatul Baqi?

Just as Sahabah are buried in Jannatul Baqi, Sahabah are also buried in Jannatul Mua'alla. There is great virtue for passing away in both Makkah Mukarramah and Madinah Munawwarah.

When Hajees returns home, is it established from our Ulama that they should feed within their home to retain the Barakah?

Hajj is a great pillar of Islam and is a great bounty. Upon its completion, if someone wishes to feed the poor and close friends and family or give some gifts

etc., then this is permissible. However, this should not be done to show-off that 'I made Hajj/Umrah' nor should it be regarded as something which is necessary, nor should a person be taking any loans - whether interest bearing or not - to have this function.

Profile Pictures & Social Media

Social media platforms like Whatsapp, Twitter, facebook and others allow a person to post a profile picture with one's portfolio and contact detail. People use this to post a photograph of themselves, spouse, child, some animate object or a picture of something relating to their personal life. Is this permissible? Please explain.

Social media is a largely open forum for anyone to access and view. As such, by posting personal pictures on social media one allows unknown individuals to see what they normally do not have access to. This can lead to people becoming curious, envious or even jealous and thereby may open the door to abuse and vice. Therefore personal and animate postings should be avoided. If one really wishes to have a profile picture, one should place an inanimate image that conveys a positive message.

The Fatwa Department of Darul Ihsan provides a wide range of services such as the issuing of rulings, verdicts, research, mediation, estate distribution and planning, general advice, etc.

The Fatwa Department receives an average of 250 questions per month - mostly via email - from around the globe. Every reply is checked and approved by at least two Muftis that serve in the department.

Informative Ulama Workshop on Palestine

lama and scholars from all over KZN attended an informative and educational workshop on the Palestine crisis on Tuesday 19 August 2014 at the Al Falaah College in Durban.

The discussion required much more time, particularly on the present



and future status of the crisis.

It was decided that a follow-up session be convened to continue the discussion and engagement with Ulama so that they can disseminate this information to the Muslim community and also set-up a structure to effectively engage with the media on the crisis.

Refreshments were provided with notes and course material made available to the participants for future reference.

The Ulama expressed their sincere appreciation for the opportunity to be part of this important initiative.

Darul Ihsan Centre has received requests from Ulama in other provinces for the programme to be held in their respective areas.

Annual Blanket Distribution 2014

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The Takbeer Of The Days Of Tashreeq

Zul-Hijjah marks the end of the Islamic calendar and hosts the greatest gathering of mankind - the Hajj.

The first ten days of Zul-Hijjah are among the most significant days in the year.

Rasulullah 🍇 said: "There are no days in which Ibadah is more beloved to Allah Ta'ala than the first ten days of Zul-Hijjah. The fast of each day is equivalent to the fast of one year and the Ibadah of each night is equivalent to the Ibadah of Laylatul Qadr." (Tirmizi)

Mas'ala 1:

It is Mustahab (recommended - not compulsory) for those making Udhiya (Qurbani) to abstain from removing any hair of the body and from clipping the nails from the first of Zul-Hijjah until completing the Qurbani.

Mas'ala 2:

It is highly rewarding to fast during the first nine days of Zul-Hijjah, especially the 9th (Day of Arafat).

Mas'ala 3:

The recitation of the Takbeer is compulsory upon every male and

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female immediately after every Fard Salah.

Days of Takbeer:

Commences: After the Fajr Salah of the Day of Arafah (09 Zul Hijjah)

Terminates: After the Asr Salah of the last day of Tashreeq (13 Zul Hijjah)

Method:

For males, it should be recited audibly once immediately after making Salam. Females should recite it softly.

Hint: Ladies may consider sticking a little reminder at the place where they perform Salah to help them remember the recitation of the

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
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
